We are honored to present the Goodwin Foundation 2024 Annual Report. On behalf of the Goodwin Foundation Board and the Goodwin University Board of Trustees, we are so grateful for your ongoing support of the University and for the life-changing impact you have made on our students.

We hope that you share in our pride as you read about the accomplishments of the past year. Through the generosity of our donors, the Foundation awarded \$477,400 in scholarship funds to 196 students. This funding was due in part to the great success of our two signature fundraising events. The 10th Annual Clambake raised net proceeds of \$59,527, and the 19th Annual Golf Tournament raised a record net of \$140,830 to support hard-working Goodwin students.

Some highlights from this year include:

- Commencement guest speaker Henry M. Zachs gifted Goodwin with a \$250,000 donation towards our endowment, which will ensure our ability to support deserving students with scholarships in perpetuity.
- Our Board of Trustees and Foundation Board responded to the 25th Anniversary Challenge and raised more than \$25,000 to award additional “finish line” scholarships to support students nearing the end of their educational journey.
- Through a generous gift from Foundation Board members Peter and Sue Klock, we created a new \$30,000 scholarship fund, the Burd Overton Fund.
- The Future Nurses Scholarship Fund was generously replenished with a \$17,000 gift from the Adelman Family Foundation.



Goodwin University hosted its 2024 Commencement on May 23 at Rentschler Field in East Hartford. Alongside the 375 students who received their degrees that day, Henry M. Zachs was honored with a doctorate degree in Humane Letters. Mr. Zachs is an entrepreneur and philanthropist who made his mark in the wireless industry and has been a trustee, advisor, board member, and donor to dozens of organizations across Connecticut. He is the founder of Endow Hartford 21, an endowment matching program that has helped more than 60 local non-profits in the Greater Hartford area build endowments for the long-term health of their organizations. 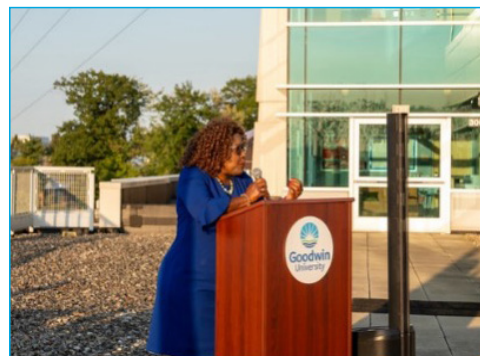

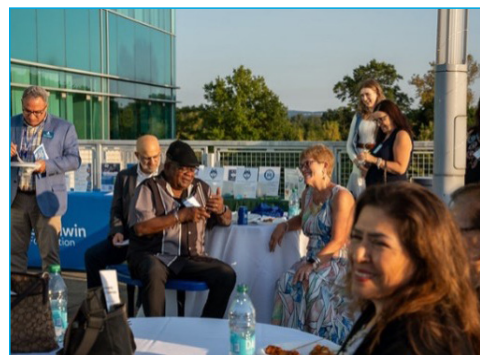

### Holiday Donor Reception

On December 16, the Goodwin Foundation hosted a “Holiday on the River” donor appreciation celebration. Lisa Simiola, this year’s Master’s Degree Scholarship recipient, shared her journey through three Nursing programs at Goodwin. Originally, she needed a program that would be conducive to her work schedule, and she graduated with a Goodwin associate degree in Nursing in 2020. Lisa reflected on the irony of the timing saying, “Welcome to nursing — here’s a global pandemic!” She went on to enroll in a bachelor’s program because, in her words, “The world stopped, but Goodwin didn’t!” Because of Goodwin’s quick switch to an online learning platform, Lisa was able to work as a travel nurse, reflecting on the time she pulled over at a rest stop in Death Valley in order to complete her discussion board posts.

Not one to be kept down, Lisa enrolled in a master’s degree program in the Spring of 2023 with a focus on mental health. She will be graduating in April 2025 and sitting for her boards to become a Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner. As a member of the third cohort to come through this brand-new program, Lisa was appreciative that the faculty asked, and listened to, what the students need. As a result, “They have adapted the curriculum of the program to best suit our needs — one of our final classes will now be dedicated to prepping for the boards.”

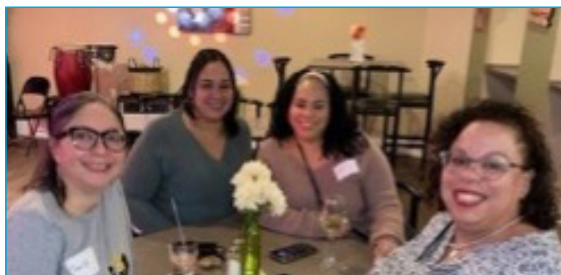

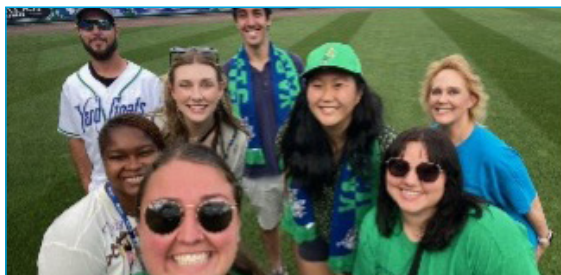

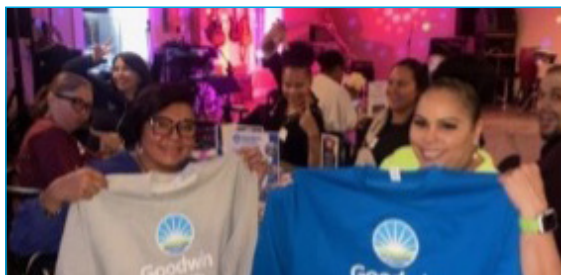
### Goodwin Night at the Hartford Athletic

## Student Supports

### The Ann B. Clark Co-op

The Ann B. Clark Co-op serves the Goodwin University community and is managed by a team of staff and students. Our strategic work with such partners as Connecticut Foodshare, ShopRite, Stop & Shop, Dairy Farmers of America, and Highland Park Market, as well as generous donations from our supporters, ensures that our shelves are always stocked with quality products. ### Student Emergency Response Fund

### Laptop Loaner Program

### Mental Health Counseling Services
