Admissions process

Our associate degree in Funeral Service is a selective admission program. Admissions are based on a point system, detailed by the Goodwin University catalog. You may apply to the program only after completing all required prerequisite coursework.

Entry requirements

- College or high school GPA of 2.7 or higher.
- Complete the College Placement Evaluations.
 Applicants must qualify to enroll in ENG 101 and
 MATH 125 to enter the Funeral Service program.
 Any additional course requirements will be
 indicated by the test results. All prerequisite
 and general education requirements must be
 completed prior to acceptance.
- Completion of BIO 120 (Goodwin University) or its equivalent with a "C" or better. Must include laboratory coursework.
- Completion of BIO 235 (Goodwin University)
 or equivalent with a "C+" or better. Laboratory
 coursework must have been completed no more
 than five years prior to application.

Enter a field with flexible opportunities

Goodwin's associate degree in Funeral Service prepares you to sit for the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards. Upon successful completion of the Arts and Sciences section of this exam, graduates will secure a year-long paid apprenticeship. After completing your apprenticeship, you will qualify to take the state board exam.

After passing your state board exam, you will be ready for a variety of Funeral Service careers, including:

- At-need and pre-need funeral arrangement consultant
- Funeral service practitioner
- Licensed embalmer
- Licensed funeral director
- Mortician
- Mortuary transporter
