

Associate Degree in Occupational Therapy Assistant

Make a career out of caring for others with an OTA degree

Occupational Therapy is a specialized treatment that helps individuals achieve independence in all facets of their lives. If you enjoy caring for others and want to help them achieve independent and satisfying lives, then a career as an occupational therapy assistant is right for you.

Our Occupational Therapy Assistant associate degree program will prepare you to care for clients who are limited by a physical illness or injury, an emotional disorder, a developmental disability, or the aging process. As an Occupational Therapy Assistant, you will work under the supervision of an Occupational Therapist and will apply functional activities and therapeutic modalities as methods of treatment. Therapy focuses on assisting clients in restoring or maintaining independence in everyday life skills.

You will gain hands-on experience through: training in activities of daily living; adapting home, work, and school environments; vocational training; and therapeutic use of functional activities. As part of your clinical work, you will learn from experienced, practicing Occupational Therapists and Occupational Therapy Assistants within a variety of healthcare and community settings.

Upon graduation, you will be qualified to sit for the national certification administered by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT). After successful completion of this exam, you will be a Certified Occupational Therapy Assistant. Connecticut requires a license in order to practice occupational therapy and the license is based on the results of the NBCOT Certification Examination.

- Student acceptance is based on the top 20 applicants who meet admission criteria (see academic catalog for the OTA Admission Criteria Point System)
- Academic coursework is primarily evening/weekend with clinical fieldwork during the day

Graduation requirements

Students must complete all of the general associate graduation requirements as stated in the catalog. In addition, students must complete the following programmatic graduation requirements:

- Complete all Occupational Therapy Assistant core courses with a minimum grade of "C+"
- Complete BIO 211 and BIO 212, or equivalent, with a minimum grade of "C+" or higher — fieldwork IIA and IIB must be completed within 18 months of completion of all academic coursework

A Progress Report will be submitted for the June 2025 meeting detailing analysis and implementation of the program's plan to successfully regain compliance of the 2018 Standard A.6.4.
