Our bachelor's degree in Public Safety and Security is an interdisciplinary program, allowing students to advance through a traditional bachelor's degree program, following either a Criminal Justice or Homeland Security Track. The Public Safety and Security coursework will build upon the foundation of our Criminal Justice and Homeland Security associate degree programs and allow students to continue their education for degree completion.

This degree emphasizes the development of professional skills and knowledge of public safety, which include grant writing, risk assessment, research methodology, policy analysis, and safety and security planning. Students will learn and apply the skills associated with evidence-based decision making. Criminal Justice courses emphasize criminal investigation, criminal procedure, and the development of the criminal justice system. Homeland Security courses emphasize emergency planning, the National Incident Management System, and personal and physical security.
