

Course format

- Complete the program in as few as 15 months, part-time.
- The M.Ed. program is offered fully online and is a blend of synchronous, live, face-to-face learning sessions
 and asynchronous independent learning.
- Benefit from the flexiblity to work full-time while earning your degree.
- For an even faster track to your future, up to 6 credits can be granted to students entering the program from prior learning as part of the Alternative Route to Certification.

Class formatting options

Our M.Ed. program is offered entirely online, giving you the flexibility you need to earn your degree. We offer a combination of synchronous and asynchronous courses, so it is structured to fit a wide variety of learning preferences.

Synchronous learning sessions

Some courses in this program are offered in the form of online, face-to-face meetings with your classmates and faculty. This gives you the opportunity to engage in important conversations and debates regarding your course material. Participating in a synchronous learning session gives you all the experience of an in-person class setting without the inconvenience of having to drive to campus.

Asynchronous courses

Our asynchronous courses are the perfect way to earn a master's degree while working around your busy schedule. Asynchronous courses are designed to be completed on your time and don't require any face-to-face meetings, so they're a great fit for the working professional. You'll work independently to complete your assignments and touch base with our faculty along the way to make sure you are getting the support you need.

M.Ed. program admissions requirements

We don't require GRE scores for admission. We know you work hard enough, so there's no need to take additional tests before admittance into the program.

Graduate applicants to Goodwin University are required to:

- Complete a graduate application for admission.
- Pay a \$50 non-refundable application fee (waived for Goodwin University graduates).
- Submit an official or unofficial transcript verifying receipt of a bachelor's degree from a college or university accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) or the equivalent of this degree from another country with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0.
 - Applicants with less than a 3.0 CGPA may be considered for conditional admittance into the program under certain circumstances.
- Provide a professional resume.
- Submit proof of immunizations (Measles, Mumps, Rubella, and Varicella).
- View the complete list of requirements in the catalog.

All applicants to the M.Ed. program must:

- Interview with the program director or faculty for admittance.
- Provide strong recommendations highlighting excellence in the applicants' previous teaching experience.
- Maintain a 3.0 GPA to graduate once accepted into the program.

Tuition information for graduate students

Paying for graduate school doesn't have to be stressful — we make it easy to understand the costs of your education before classes even begin.

We are committed to helping you earn your degree at a cost that is affordable to you. At Goodwin, there are a variety of financial aid opportunities available to students, including scholarships, grants, student loans that will eventually need to be repaid, and work-study opportunities that provide a regular paycheck.




