

Participate in hands-on clinical training.

At Goodwin University, we give you the hands-on experience you need to be successful in a real healthcare setting. You'll begin by learning basic concepts of biology, anatomy, and medical terminology though traditional classroom teaching methods. You'll gain experience charting patient records, preparing patients for examinations and procedures, and performing basic laboratory testing. Gain the skills to become nationally certified.

While national certification is not a federal requirement for practicing medical assistants, many employers do require that their medical assistants earn and maintain certification from a third-party organization. At Goodwin, you'll sharpen the skills needed to successfully complete these examinations and gain certification. Getting certified is a great way to show prospective employers that you've acquired specialized skills that meet industry standards.

When you earn your certificate in Medical Assisting at Goodwin, you are immediately eligible to apply for the following certifications:

- The Certified Medical Assistant (CMA) examination administered by the American Association of Medical Assistants (AAMA)
- The Registered Medical Assistant (RMA) examination administered by the American Medical Technologists (AMT)
- The Medical Assistant Certification (CCMA) examination administered by the National Healthcareer Association (NHA)

Course format

Class formatting options

Courses are offered in on-campus, online, and hybrid formats.

On-campus classes

Engaging in in-person clinical training is an essential part of becoming a medical assistant. When you come to campus, you'll receive hands-on training and experience working in a setting similar to a real medical office — you'll graduate with the important professional skillsets for success in the field.

Online classes

Online classes are perfect if you're working full-time or managing your personal responsibilities. Courses are offered in synchronous and asynchronous sessions.

▶ Synchronous

Some courses in this program are offered in the form of online, face-to-face meetings with your classmates and faculty. This gives you the opportunity to engage in important conversations and debates regarding your course material. Participating in a synchronous learning session gives you the experience of an in-person class setting without the inconvenience of having to drive to campus.

▶ Asynchronous

Our asynchronous courses are the perfect way to earn your certificate while working around your busy schedule. Asynchronous courses can be completed on your time and don't require any face-to-face meetings, so they're a great fit for the working professional. You'll work independently to complete your assignments and touch base with our faculty along the way to make sure you are getting the support you need.

Hybrid (online/on-campus) classes

Many students enjoy our hybrid class format, which offers the best of both worlds — both online assignments and on-campus responsibilities. This will allow you to make time for your personal responsibilities while still working toward your degree.

Certificate in Medical Assisting admissions requirements

All applicants to the Medical Assisting program must:

- Complete the application for admission into Goodwin University. Applicants to the Medical Assisting program must first meet the requirements for admission and be accepted into Goodwin University
- Complete the following prerequisite courses with a minimum grade of a "C" or better:
 - ► HSC 105 Medical Terminology
 - ▶ BIO 101 Concepts in Human Biology
- Complete the Medical Assisting program application
- Interview with the Program Director and/or Practicum Coordinator before admission


